# Fall Colors 2023 Bead Challenge

The colors of fall may be bright (such as the red, orange, and yellow leaves on trees) or muted (such as the browns, greys, and deep purples of the forest as it gets ready for winter). Choose a color palette that illustrates your vision of fall colors and create a beaded object (jewelry or non-jewelry). There is no kit for this challenge.

#### **Rules:**

- **1.** All submissions must be completed by you prior to the October 17, 2023 BSNM general meeting (and made after the October 2022 general meeting).
- 2. You may create a piece/set of jewelry (such as necklace, earrings, and/or bracelet) or a non-jewelry/mixed-media item (such as a decorated pumpkin, figurine, box, or wall hanging) for this challenge. (Only one entry in one category per person.)
- **3.** At least 25% of the finished project must be beads and/or jewelry elements (beads; cabochons; rhinestones; chain; old earrings, pendants, charms; etc.) incorporated into the design.
- **4.** You may add any elements such as paint, decoupage, and/or found objects you need to complete your project.
- 5. Your finished project must be brought to the October 2023 general meeting where members will vote and prizes will be awarded. There will be two categories for entries: jewelry and non-jewelry.
- **6.** Judging will be based on creativity in presentation and materials, and mastery in craftsmanship. Judging will also be based in part on how closely the entries followed the rules. Prizes will be awarded!

Happy beading and good luck with the challenge! Try to use this challenge to broaden your beading horizons. Learn something new or try something different!

During our 45 years TierraCast grew from a single jeweler's bench to a business that, at its peak, employed 49 people. The loyalty of our customers, commitment of our employees, and strength and support of our vendors and trade partners have enabled the business to thrive for most of its life. We can only imagine the effect that our impending closure will have on people who have supported and counted on us all these years. #### **BSNM 2024 Elections**

Although it is only August, the October elections are practically around the corner. All positions on the 2024 Board are open for anyone who wants to run. It would be wonderful if people would shadow the current officers and learn on the go before taking over.

For the current version of the bylaws, which contains the complete duties of the officers, go to <a href="https://www.beadsocietynm.org">www.beadsocietynm.org</a> and log in to the website (you may need to register first if you haven't done so before). Click on the Members Only section in the upper right corner and then click on the Bylaws box on the left side of the page that opens (you may need to temporarily disable your pop-up blocker since the PDF opens in a new window or tab). In the bylaws you can read about every position on the Board and decide which one best suits your abilities and your time. The following is a brief description of the duties of the Board positions:

**President (currently Barbara Rosen)** – Preside at all general and Board meetings; oversee committees; sign contracts with the Treasurer; provide a president's column for the newsletter

**1st Vice President-Classes and Special Events** – Coordinate instructors and students for bead society-sponsored workshops; create brochures and flyers for workshops, when required; assist with special events in which BSNM participates

**2nd Vice President-Programs (currently Pat Verrelle) –** Plan and arrange programs for the general meetings and for each Bead Time session

**Treasurer (currently Deb Cole)** – Be custodian of all BSNM funds; keep an itemized account of all receipts and disbursements; submit a budget for Board discussion and approval; make payments in accordance with the budget upon receipt of receipts and completed reimbursement forms; prepare monthly financial reports; file taxes and renew business license

**Secretary (currently Helen Yackel) –** Record the proceedings of the Board meetings and the October general election meeting; send minutes to Board members in a timely fashion; conduct general correspondence of BSNM regarding business-related items

**Membership Chair (currently Deb Cole and Barbara Rosen) –** Collect dues and distribute membership cards; collect monies for raffle tickets at general meetings; process online renewals for members and new members; maintain accuracy of Gmail and BSNM website databases of members

**Membership Recruiter -** Oversee and form a Welcome Committee; visit bead stores, shows, and events for the purpose of recruiting new members

**Newsletter Editor (currently Jill Bartel) –**Solicit, edit, and write articles for the Newsletter; maintain business member ads for publication; publish newsletter via email to all members

**Volunteer Coordinator –** Coordinate volunteer recruitment and scheduling for events where BSNM has a table/booth or where the BSNM's assistance has been requested; ensure membership applications and business cards are available for these events

**Member-at-Large (currently Laurye Tanner) –**Be responsible for representing the suggestions and concerns of the general membership to the Board

**Webmaster (currently Amanda Archuleta) –**Manage the content posted on the BSNM website;
maintain the technical contracts for website,
including eCommerce, webhosting, and event
coordination applications

**Social Media Manager –** Maintain the BSNM Facebook page and other social networking accounts; add BSNM events to Facebook page; monitor Facebook activity for messages, likes, and unauthorized links to commercial pages

Meeting Coordinator (currently Claudette Jaramillo) – Recruit volunteers to bring refreshments to the general meetings; set up and monitor the show-and-tell tables; assist with setting up and taking down tables and chairs, if necessary; make sure there are paper plates, napkins, forks, etc., for each meeting

Photographer (currently Pam Troutman) – Take photographs at meetings and events, including all contest entries and winners; provide photos to Webmaster, Social Media Manager, and Newsletter Editor for publication

**Historian** – Maintain speakers' records; keep "lessons learned" documentation (record classes taught, when, and by whom)

Please decide to run for office. You will be very instrumental in continuing the growth of the BSNM and making the necessary changes to stay relevant and helping us to stay on an upward trajectory. It is an honorable thing to sacrifice some time for something you care about and believe in and that benefits others.

Without your contributions of time and energy, the bead society as we know it will cease to exist: **as a 501(3)(c) non-profit organization, we are** required by law to have at least a president, vice president, secretary, and treasurer on our Board. Without these four essential offices, the Bead Society of New Mexico will be forced to give up its non-profit status and become a "hobby club," which includes paying taxes at the state and federal level.

## The Nature of Glass Exhibit

New Mexico Museum of Art, 107 W. Palace Ave., Santa Fe through December 31, 2023

"The Nature of Glass" exhibit focuses on 28 contemporary works by such household names as Judy Chicago, Georgia O'Keefe, and Preston Singletary, as well as William Morris, Robert Wilson, and Tony Jojola.

The featured techniques include blown, hot-wired, etched, assemblage, sand carved, cast, kiln-formed, stained, and more. Most of the works reflect nature or the environment via images of flora and fauna, as well as the human body, said curator Christian Waguespack.

"This looks at how [artists] brought nature into their work through the representation of flowers, animals, the body, space, science, and the environment," Waguespack said. "It's pretty broad."

Glass has been used as an artistic medium for thousands of years and remains one of the world's most prevalent art forms.

"Glass is becoming more and more popular in New Mexico," Waguespack said. "We've got several glass studios in Santa Fe. Even [famed glass artist Dale] Chihuly taught at the Institute of Indian Arts and Culture. It's definitely got a presence here and a big, strong following."



# Peridot in Space: August's Birthstone is Out of This World

Think your August birthstone, peridot, is out of this world? You're right!

Peridot belongs to the mineral family olivine, and olivine is found not only in volcanic sands in Hawaii and the deserts of the American Southwest, but in meteorites called pallasites. The pallasite type of meteorite is embedded with olivine crystal inclusions. Pallasites, which are often cut into thin sections to allow light to pass through the olivine bits, are in a class by themselves. In a pallasite, the crystal comes already "set" in a sense, with the stone wrapped in metal even before it's been put into a gold mounting.

It's impossible to look at a pallasite like the one in this ring (above) by Ferber's Unique Fine Jewelry in Flowood, Mississippi, and not be mesmerized by its history, its formation in a world so completely hostile to human beings. Yet now it's possible to hold it—or wear it—in hand.

These stony-iron meteorites are thought to have come from the mantle of a planet that once orbited between Mars and Jupiter. It's not known what happened to it,


but any fan of Star Trek can imagine. And then, in 2011 researchers using the Spitzer infrared telescope at Caltech discovered crystals of olivine raining down into an embryonic star far away in the constellation of Orion.

#### **Gemstones Raining Down**

Gasses near the surface of the burgeoning star were hot enough to cook up the nascent olivine, then shoot it up into the clouds where it "ultimately fell down again like glitter," said one of the researchers, Tom Megeath. Although the environment around the new star would be "very dark," said another of the researchers, Charles Poteet, "tiny crystals might catch whatever light is present, resulting in a green sparkle against a black, dusty backdrop." Peridots are found in less than 1% of known meteorites, making them very rare indeed.
